PALO DURO STABLES AND SIX GUN CITY AT TIMBER SPRINGS

Since 1962 visitors have enjoyed riding the miles of trails on gentle horses in Palo Duro Canyon. There are miles of trails for beginner or experienced riders. Visitors can receive riding lessons, enjoy camping and hiking, or watch authentic gunfight reenactments. Located on TX 217 just a mile from the entrance to the state park, this popular attraction has been used in several movies. ROCK ISLAND RAIL TRAIL

Nearly 4 miles of improved trail from 7th and Crockett in downtown Amarillo to Coulter Dr. near the Medical Center. It is ideal for walking, running, biking or exercising a pet. The trail is named for the Rock Island Line, the famed railroad that operated along this trail in the early 1900s.

CADILLAC RANCH

The world's only! Ten Cadillacs buried nose down in a field at the same angle as the Cheops Pyramid. Exit 60, Arnot Road on the south side of I-40.

TEXAS PANHANDLE WAR MEMORIAL

This memorial, located at I-27 and Georgia Street next to the Randall County Annex is a tribute to all the men and women of the Texas Panhandle who answered the call to duty.

AMARILLO SKATE PARK

Located in John Stiff Memorial Park near 45th and Bell Streets. Amarillo's newest recreation facility is the 10,000 sq ft Skate Park, featuring a 20-foot diameter pipe. Open from sunrise to sunset - free admission. (806) 378-4290

ROUTE 66 HISTORIC DISTRICT

Over one mile of antiques and collectibles await the visitor to Old San Jacinto, one of the city's first residential and business districts, located along historic Route 66. Buildings that once housed theaters, cafes and drug stores are now quaint antique, craft and specialty shops. Some unique dining experiences are also available. On 6th Avenue between Georgia and Western Streets.

LLANO CEMETERY

2900 S. Hayes. Officially started in 1890, the cemetery has always been Amarillo's principal burying ground. Most of the city's prominent pioneer families were laid to rest here.

"MADAM QUEEN"

2nd & Lincoln Street. The only (prototype) 2-10-2 "Texas type" locomotive 5000, especially built for the Plains Division of the Santa Fe Railroad in 1930. The locomotive's name was derived from an imaginary character on the Amos & Andy show.

POLK STREET HISTORIC DISTRICT

These two blocks of Polk Street, between 15th and 17th, were developed between 1905 and 1915 and are considered the finest stretch of historic residential neighborhood. Once the most elegant street in the city, the district includes the Harrington House, Lee Bivins House, J.D. Shuford House, Doheny-Masterson House, Shelton-Houghton House, Galbraith House, Eakle House and Early House.

POTTER COUNTY COURTHOUSE - Built in 1932, the neo-classical courthouse is the centerpiece of a group of fine structures. 500 S. Fillmore.

CHASE TOWER - Downtown, at the corner of Tyler and 7th Streets. It is the tallest building between Fort Worth and Denver.

SANTA FE BUILDING

Downtown, at the corner of Polk and 9th Streets. Built 1928-1930 as regional headquarters for the Santa Fe Railway, this is the last and best of Amarillo's skyscrapers built in the 1930s. Recently refurbished, the building re-opened in August 2000 as Potter County offices and it reigns once again as an Amarillo landmark. In the future, an extensive railroad museum may be added.

SPORTS AND FACILITIES

AMARILLO DILLAS

Returning in 2006, the Amarillo Dillas will once again bring professional baseball to the area. As members of United League Baseball, the Dillas are one of six teams playing in this, the newest independent baseball league in the US. Other teams include Alexandria, LA, and Edinburg, Laredo, Rio Grande Valley, and San Angelo, TX. Dillas home games will be in Potter County Memorial Stadium (aka The Dilla Villa), located on the north end of Amarillo's Tri-State Fairgrounds. The summer schedule will stretch from May 30

This state of the art facility is located in downtown Amarillo. Easy access to Interstates 27 and 40. The Amarillo Civic Center is an excellent choice for conventions, meetings, concerts and special events. The Amarillo National Center, located on the Tri-State Fairgrounds, is the newest facility in Amarillo for equestrian events.
