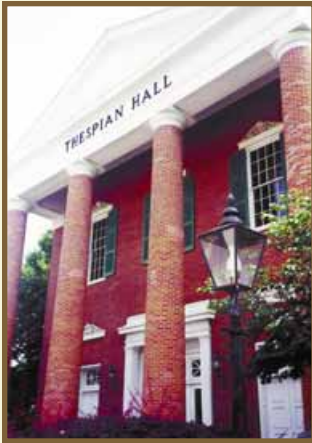

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Casino gaming brings thousands of visitors to Boonville each month.



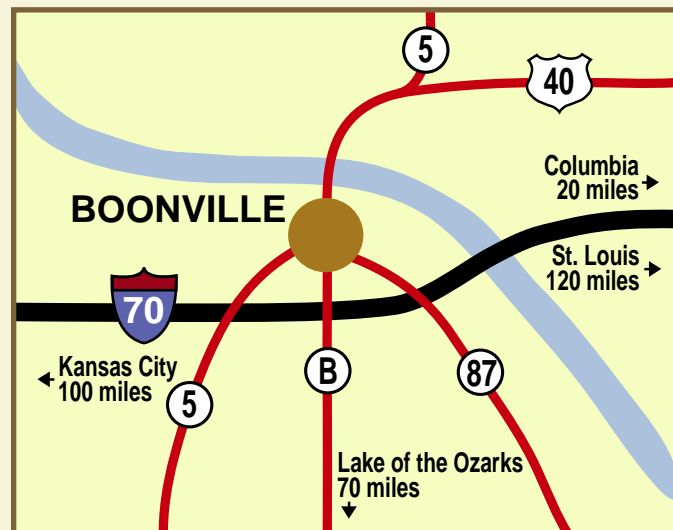


Hannah Cole, the pioneer mother of the region, and many other historic notables are honored with public art in downtown Boonville.
