1 Cheyenne Frontier Days™

8th Ave at Frontier Park

The Daddy of 'em All has been kicking up dust since 1897 with the world's largest outdoor rodeo and Western Celebration. Highlighting ten days of rip-roarin' excitement is the world's best PRCA rodeo action and Western entertainment. On tap for night shows is a selection of music superstars. It's non-stop activity and hospitality at its Western best! July 23– Aug 1, 2010.

2 Cheyenne Frontier Days™ Old West Museum & Store

Frontier Park, 4610 Carey Ave

Showcases one of the largest Western carriage collections in the US. Changing exhibits complement displays of Cheyenne Frontier Days™ and Western memorabilia, including the "Bullfighters – The Risky Road to Glory" exhibit, opening in May 2010. 3 Cheyenne Frontier Days™ Old West Museum & Store

121 W 15th St

A National Historic Landmark, this former Union Pacific Depot has been restored to its original glory. Home to a visitor center and restaurant, the Depot also features the **Cheyenne Depot Museum**, rich with railroad history, exhibits and interactive displays. Outside, the Cheyenne Depot Plaza plays host to concerts and other events. Mon – Fri, 9 am – 5 pm; Sat, 9 am – 5 pm; Sun, 11 am – 5 pm. Extended summer hours. 307-632-3905. Gift Shop: 307-638-6338.

4 Wyoming State Capitol and State Museum

One dates back to 1887, the other is newly renovated...and both offer a wealth of Wyoming history. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the State Capitol (*Capitol Ave & 24th St*) boasts marble floors, fine woodwork, stained glass, historic photographs and a wildlife display. The neighboring Wyoming State Museum (*2301 Central Ave*) features artifacts, various collections and gift shop, full of souvenirs and Wyoming books. *Capitol hrs:* Mon – Fri, 8 am – 5 pm. 307-777-7220. *Museum hrs:* Mon – Sat, 9 am – 4:30 pm (Sat hrs, Nov – Apr: 10 am – 2 pm). 307-777-7022. 5 Terry Bison Ranch

Western entertainment just as you'd expect is but a short drive south of town. Home to 3,000 bison, the ranch is full of high kickin' good old fashioned fun, featuring outdoor cooking, horseback rides, fishing, train tours of the bison herd, and a saloon. 307-634-4171.

Big Boy Steam Engine

*Holiday Park
(17th St & Morrie Ave)*
Even in retirement, Old Number 4004 remains an imposing sight. The world's largest steam locomotive, this powerful coal-fired engine was designed to pull a 3600-ton train over steep grades between Cheyenne and Ogden, Utah. The 4004 is one of eight remaining Big Boys on display throughout the country.



Nelson Museum of the West

1714 Carey Ave
Over 11,000 sq. feet of exhibits, including Indian artifacts, cowboy trappings, 19th century weapons, outlaw memorabilia, and military exhibits (1860-1943). Open May 1 - Oct 31: Mon - Fri, 9 am - 4:30 pm. June - Aug: Open Sat. 307-635-7670. AAA Gem.



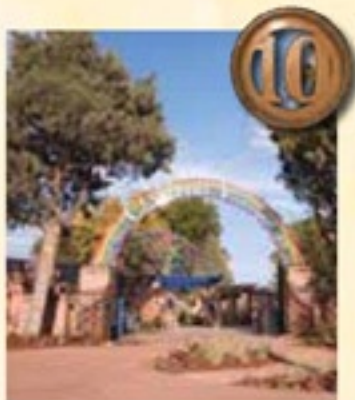
Cheyenne Street Railway Trolley

Historic Governors' Mansion:

300 E 21st (21st & House Ave).
Home of Wyoming governors, including U.S.'s first woman governor. Open June-Aug, Mon - Sat, 9 am - 6 pm, Sundays, 1 - 5 pm. Sept-May, Mon - Sat, 9 am - 5 pm. Closed Nov and Dec 25 - Jan 15. 307-777-7878. No charge. Call for group tours.



Cheyenne Gunslingers:

15th and Pioneer. Enactments of gunfights and other Wild West activities. Mon - Fri, 6 pm; noon on Saturdays. June 7 - July 27. 307-778-3133 or 1-800-426-5009.

F.E. Warren Air Force Base:

Randall Ave and I-25. Originally named Fort D.A. Russell, today it serves as a command center for US Intercontinental Ballistic Missiles and as a training ground for the US Air Force. 307-773-3381. Limited public access for those without military ID. Call in advance.



Bit-O-Wyo Ranch: 470 Happy Jack Rd. Home to spectacular horseback riding and the Horse Barn Dinner Show. Enjoy music by the Blue Water Cowboy Band. Fri and Sat, 6:30 pm, Memorial Day - Labor Day. 307-638-6924. Reservations required.

University of Wyoming Archaeological Dig Site:

I-80 Rest Area at Pine Bluffs. Active site of historic Indian relics and pre-historic artifacts dating back 11,000 years. June – Aug. 307-245-3695. Call in advance.

F.E. Warren Museum:

F.E. Warren Air Force Base. History of Fort D.A. Russell. Portrays military life in late 1800s. Also home of the ICBM Missile Museum. Mon – Fri, 8 am – 4 pm. 307-773-2980. Limited public access for those without military ID. Call in advance.

Wyoming National Guard Museum:
